GED: i-Pathways Information

i-Pathways is a technology based High School Equivalency Test Preparation program. It provides students with standards based instruction content aligned to the GED test.

How do I start?

We have 10 seats available in i-Pathways. We will register your account, give you a login, and show you how to navigate the site. You need to log in and work on the subject you've selected at least once a week to keep your account active.

What happens if I don't log in once a week and work on my subject area?


You will receive a notification from your teacher reminding you to log in and work on the subject you selected. After the second warning, you will be archived from i-Pathways. If there is a wait list, you will be placed on this list until the next spot opens. All work you completed will be lost and you will need to start over. Please remember to keep your account active at all times to prevent account deactivation.

What do I have to do before I take a GED test?

You have to complete the online WOWI Career Assessment and the DPI form. This will allow us to gather information from your high school and fax it to NWTC so you can register to take a GED test. To save yourself time, have this completed before you finish your first subject in i-Pathways.

What do I do when I am finished with all the required lessons in the assigned subject?

Come in and take a pre-test. If you score a 70% or higher on the pre-test, you will be ready to register for the GED test on MyGED.

Where do I take the GED tests?

You can use your MyGed account to take your GED test at NWTC or Fox Valley Technical College.

What do I do after I take my first test?

Once you pass your first GED test, we will open another subject of your choice for you to study.

How are the vouchers issued?

We will issue a voucher for you to take your GED test one time (per test) if you are Oneida enrolled or an employee. A practice test is required first and to take subsequent test, you must prove you passed the previous test in your MyGED account.

What tests do I have to take at NWTC?

- Math
- Language Arts
- Social Studies
- Civics Literacy
- Science
